Copy of Resolution No. 06 of the General House session of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, Sri Amritsar dated Chayt 16 Samvat 556 Nanakshahi (March 29, 2024):-

Today's General House session of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, Sri Amritsar declares the government's ignorance towards the release of Bandi Singhs (Sikh prisoners) as a big discrimination against the Sikhs in their own country. The house feels that injustice is being done by the government with the Sikh prisoners by ignoring their human rights, as they have served double sentences than life imprisonment within the scope of the Constitution.

This is a very important and serious matter for the Sikh community, towards which the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee has always maintained its dynamism and progress. Considering the seriousness of this matter, the highest temporal authority of the Sikh community, Sri Akal Takht Sahib, also formed a high-level five-member committee to hold talks with the Government of India, which made continuous efforts to initiate talks with the government, but there was no positive response from the government side. The negative attitude of the Centre government is not only a hindrance in the way of justice to Bandi Singhs, but it is also a non-serious approach towards the supremacy and dignity of Sri Akal Takht Sahib. The Government of India led by Sri Narendra Modi should never forget that the history of Sri Akal Takht Sahib has been of breaking even the pride of oppressive Mughal rule and great Rulers and Maharajas have also bowed down here.

Today's General House makes it clear to the Centre government that the formation of the five-member committee by Sri Akal Takht Sahib regarding Bandi Singhs is connected with the history and principles. Therefore, the Centre government, respecting Sri Akal Takht Sahib, should open the way for talks with the five-member committee on the issue of Bandi Singhs and should not force the Sikh community to walk on the path of struggle.

Copy of Resolution No. 08 of the General House session of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, Sri Amritsar dated Chait 16 Samvat 556 Nanakshahi (March 29, 2024):-

Today's General House session of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, Sri Amritsar strongly supports struggle of the farmers of the country for their rightful demands. It is sad that the Governments are committing atrocities on the farmers, who are known as the world's *Annadata* (food provider), due to which they are forced to do strong protests. The Governments are resorting to conspiracies to suppress the rightful demands of the farmers who have come out on the roads. Even, Haryana Government did not avoid committing indiscriminate atrocities on the farmers, which caused the death of a young farmer Shubhkaran Singh and hundreds of peasants were injured. At the behest of the Centre Government, the Haryana Government stopped farmers from going to Delhi, a large number of rubber bullets and tear gas shells were fired, water cannons were used and cane-charging was done, and at the same time, the attitude of the Government of Punjab led by Shri Bhagwant Mann has also proved to be anti-farmer. The Government of Punjab, by joining the tone of the Centre government, allowed the Haryana Government to commit atrocities on the farmers. This is confirmed from the delay in lodging the First Information Report (FIR) for several days after the death of young farmer Shubhkaran Singh. The Punjab Government allied with the Centre Government by allowing the Haryana Government to attack the farmers even in Punjab state's jurisdiction. Today's session condemns this entire phenomenon in strong words.

The General House of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, Sri Amritsar feels that the rigid attitude of the Government of India towards the demands of the farmers is not good and it is also a matter of concern for the future of the country. This house appeals to the Government of India to leave its stubbornness and announce to accept the demands of the farmers. Today's session demands from the Government of India that a fair investigation should be conducted into the atrocities committed by the Haryana Government on the farmers and adequate compensation should be given to the victims, including the youth who was killed.

The General House also demands from the Government of Punjab to give adequate compensation to the family of the farmer killed during the farmers' agitation and of the injured farmers.



Copy of Resolution No. 09 of the General House session of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, Sri Amritsar dated Chayt 16 Samvat 556 Nanakshahi (March 29, 2024):-

Today's General House session of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, Sri Amritsar strongly condemns the Government's interference in the institutions of Sikh community. The General House feels that Governments are interfering unnecessarily in Sikh institutions. While efforts are being made by the Governments to break the Sikh institutions through worldly courts, conspiracies are also hatched to take control of the Gurdwara management. Forming a separate Haryana Sikh Gurdwara Management Committee (HSGMC) by breaking the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee through the Supreme Court, Government of Punjab led by the Aam Aadmi Party bringing the Sikh Gurdwaras Amendment Bill 2023 in the Legislative Assembly in an interference with the Sikh Gurdwaras Act 1925, management of the Delhi Sikh Gurdwara Management Committee as per the intention of the Centre Government, influencing the management of Takht Sri Harmandar Ji Patna Sahib management board with government machinery and efforts to reduce the number of members of Sikh organizations and increase the representation of Government nominees in the board of Takht Sri Hazur Abchalnagar Sahib, Nanded; are examples of Government's interference in Sikh institutions.





Today's General House Session of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, Sri Amritsar, urges Governments to fulfill their responsibilities to prevent organized conspiracy and hate propoganda against Sikhs on social media platforms. The Sikh history is rooted in safeguarding the nation's integrity, yet some individuals propogate false propoganda against Sikhs, disregarding this legacy. Social media is being used as a weapon against the community to spread hatred and discord among communities but Governments remain passive observers. Conversely, pro-Punjab and pro-Sikh social media accounts often face censorship, with some being shut down.

Despite appeals from the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee to block anti-Sikh propoganda accounts, the concerned authorities have failed to take substantive action. Today's General House implores the Centre Government to investigate such accounts fostering communal discord and ensure the reverence of all religions within the country.

Furthermore, the General House urges the Sikh community to be mindful when commenting on religious and community's matters on social media, ensuring that their remarks do not offend Sikh history, principles, Rehat Maryada (code of conduct), or sentiments of anyone.
